

Native Trees and Grass Available

This year's TreeFest event will be held Friday, January 17th and Saturday, January 18th from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., or until trees run out, in front of JC Penney *inside* Independence Mall. Available tree species include bald cypress, black walnut, red maple, silky dogwood, sweetgum, crape myrtle, cherrybark oak, chestnut oak, live oak, white oak, and longleaf pine. In addition, Indiangrass will be available.

Please note: species availability is subject to change without notice and are available first come, first serve. There is a limit of five trees and/or grasses per household. Trees are free, but a donation of \$5 per household is suggested to help ensure that TreeFest will continue next year.
